





a small number of homeless or at-risk individuals have a large interaction with the hospital, EMS, police and corrections systems



for example:

- one individual had 32 visits (20%) to the ER out of 160 total visits by the survey respondents
- four individuals had 108 interactions (40%) with police out of 269 total interactions by survey respondents

top 3 reasons for housing loss

- addiction/ substance abuse
- illness or medical condition

- low income
- rent too high
- addictions
